THE CITY OF LAUDERHILL SOLICITED PROPOSALS FROM INTERESTED PARTIES FOR OPERATION, MAINTENANCE AND MANAGEMENT SERVICES FOR THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT UTILITY SYSTEM. TWO FIRMS RESPONDED TO THE SOLICITATION AND THE EVALUATION COMMITTEE RANKED THE SUBMITTALS AND RECOMMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

1. PATIENT CARE LABORATORIES, INC. d/b/a MICRIM LABS INC.
2. U.S. WATER SERVICES CORPORATION

IN THE EVENT THE TOP RANKED FIRM IS UNABLE TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE CITY OR THE CITY MANAGER IS UNABLE TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACT, STAFF WILL CONTINUE TO THE NEXT FIRM UNTIL THE RANKED LIST HAS BEEN EXHAUSTED.
