Neighborhood Enrichment Appearance Team

The NEAT Team Initiative is designed to improve the overall appearance of the City while ensuring compliance with fire, safety, and property maintenance standards. The goal is to set an example by first restoring City - owned properties, establishing the standard for private property owners to follow. This will be accomplished through dedicated inspections, direct engagement with property owners, and providing guidance and resources to support compliance.



Phase One – City - Owned Properties

October – December 2025

The first phase focuses on City - owned properties to lead by example.

- Weekly inspections are conducted every Tuesday.
- Departments identify beautification and safety improvements.
- Repairs and enhancements are coordinated across departments.

To date, 18 inspections have been completed —beginning with City Hall and several parks. Inspections will continue through the rest of the City and conclude by December 2025.

Phase Two – Commercial Properties

January – April 2026

Phase two targets commercial properties, starting with high traffic areas.

- Convenience stores
- Shopping centers and malls
- Entertainment district

This phase will expand to all commercial properties citywide, reinforcing shared responsibility for maintaining a clean, safe, and inviting environment.

Phase Three – Residential Properties

May – October 2026

The final phase centers on residential neighborhoods, encouraging residents to take pride in their surroundings.

- Focus on property maintenance and beautification
- Education and outreach to promote compliance and community care

Tentative timelines may adjust as needed to ensure quality and engagement throughout each phase.

By addressing City properties first and then engaging commercial and residential partners, we aim to inspire a citywide movement toward lasting beautification and safety.
