Vice Mayor Berger wished to know if the proposed ordinance or existing City regulations covered when a neighbor allowed their dogs to roam a neighborhood without a leash.

City Attorney Hall stated the City's regulations already contained a leash law.

Vice Mayor Berger remarked the situation with the dogs had been going on in his neighborhood for some time, and he believed, in order for a citation to be issued, the police or code officer had to personally witness the dog(s) off their leash. He asked if in the situation he mentioned would code or police officer have to come by to actually hear the incessant barking.

City Attorney Hall answered yes, as the proposed ordinance sought to address odors, noise, etc., so when the code or police officer came on scene, they could see, smell or hear the nuisance being complained about. Most times an officer had to personally witness an offense in order to issue a citation, similar to that of a misdemeanor, unlike in the case of a felony, which did not have to happen in the presence of an officer.

Vice Mayor Berger understood, though many times the violation was not on display when the officer arrived on scene.

Mayor Thurston sought clarification the subject resolution concerned an easement that was being given to the City.

City Attorney Hall answered yes, with any development, the developer/owner had to install the infrastructure, such as underground pipes and fire hydrants, after which they conveyed an easement to the City to allow City staff to maintain the infrastructure. The City received a bill of sale that itemized the items being conveyed to the City, such as linear feet of pipe, fire hydrants, etc., all the elements being added to the City's public infrastructure.

Mayor Thurston recalled the City had taken lift stations in the past.

City Attorney Hall affirmed this to be the case, noting there was a time when Inverrary was being built by a private developer, and they did not convey the lift stations at the end of construction, but when the infrastructure started having problems and was failing, they conveyed them to the City. At present, the City owned the lift stations in Lauderhill.

Commissioner Campbell wished all the residents of Lauderhill a Happy Thanksgiving. He said the CASA Youth Classic would take place on December 11 through 15, 2019, at which youngsters were allowed to receive scholarships, and coaches were invited from around the U. S. to observe them in play a short tournament.. He said hundreds of youths benefited through this program, and the public was invited to the tournament to enjoy the games and lend support to the participating youths. It was a free event.

Commissioner Bates wished everyone a healthy and Happy Thanksgiving, reminding everyone that on Wednesday, December 4, 2019, the City would hold its Tree Lighting Holiday Party at City Hall starting at 5:00 p.m.

Vice Mayor Berger said a health fair and toy giveaway would take place on December 21, 2019, from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. It was a pre-community event presented by the West Ken Lark Homeowners' Association (HOA) and other organizations at the Lauderhill Mall, and there would be a wealth of health resources from local providers. On Wednesday, November 27, 2019, starting at 10:00 a.m., there would be a Thanksgiving food distribution drive at the Nazareth Baptist Church, 5051 NW 47th Avenue, Lauderhill, and the giveaways were on a first come, first serve basis; sponsors making the giveaway possible included Farm Share, Nadia Assad, who would give out information on the 2020 Census, and the Democratic Women's Club of Broward. He wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving, and thanked his fellow Commissioners for voting him in as Vice Mayor.

Commissioner Grant thanked Commissioner Bates for her service as Vice Mayor for the past year, congratulating Vice Mayor Berger for his appointment as Vice Mayor. She wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving, thanking Director Irvin Kiffin and his staff of the Parks & Leisure Services (PALS) Department for coordinating the community giveaway held on November 21, 2019, at West Ken Lark Park, where 100 families were given baskets, including turkeys. The event was well received by residents, and everyone was joyful in the giving and receiving. She indicated more turkeys would be given away to ChildNet, the foster care system, and to a few Lauderhill churches; it was important to make sure the City was able to give to those persons in need, and she reached out to Mr. Hobbs, who helped her identify some things, and Deputy City Manager Giles-Smith was helpful in ensuring everything ran smoothly. The turkeys would be delivered on November 26, 2019, between 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. She again thanked staff for helping to coordinate the effort, as this was what service was all about.

City Manager Faranda wished everyone a safe and Happy Thanksgiving.

Mayor Thurston noted on the past Friday, the City of Lauderhill co-hosted a job fair with UPS at the Sadkin Center, where over 120 people showed up, and 75 persons were hired on the spot. He said in the early 1970s, UPS came on college campuses looking for new employees, and several of his classmates worked at UPS for 30 years, so it was a great introduction to a new company. He commended the MIS staff, as the applications were completed online, and staff did a great job of having everything in place for people to get hired. The next Jazz Picnic in the Park, at the Ilene Lieberman Botanical Gardens, would take place on Sunday, December 8, 2019, with the band Blues Therapy & Jazz. He noted the first event in the gardening series would be on December 5, 2019, at City Hall in the Multipurpose Room; rain barrel irrigation would be the topic of discussion. He thanked Commissioner Bates for her service as Vice Mayor for the last year, stating he looked forward to newly appointed Vice Mayor Berger's service to the City over the next year. He wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Commissioner Campbell knew the meeting agenda had an item that was removed regarding newly elected Broward County Mayor Dale Holness. He wished to publicly congratulate Mayor Holness on his election to Mayor of Broward County, and his election to County Mayor was very relevant to Lauderhill, as he began his political career as a City Commissioner of Lauderhill, during which he represented the City well, and he served as a County Commissioner for some time. At that time, the entire City would have the opportunity to honor him, and everyone in Lauderhill hoped, while he served on the County Commission, he would send many dollars to the City.
