Community Centers

St George Park

The mural by the artist Georgeta Fondos, was guided by Mrs. Wilkerson and the Broward Estates St. George's HOA Members.... and honors those who served in their community.

West Ken Lark Park

The HOA, led by Miss Cooper, selected three artists, including one who lives in Lauderhill, Nate Dee, to install work on the inside of the community center which is representative of the community and center history.

Community Centers

Vets Park

The internationally renowned artist, Ernesto Maranje, was selected for this project and installed an outdoor and indoor connection artwork. This artwork represents and celebrates local flora and fauna.



Cricket World Cup



Public art for the cricket tournament was created with local artists consisting of a large mural on the LPAC wall and larger-than-life cricket bat. These were displayed during the tournament.

LPAC Outdoor Sculpture

The sculpture was completed in November 2024 and was funded by the Broward County cultural affairs department.





CURRENT PROJECTS

Wally Elfers Park Fountain

The artist, Rosario Psy, is in the process of installing finished painted artwork on the fountain in the park. The mosaic on the fountain itself is completed. It is anticipated this project will be complete by February 2025.

Fire Station 9/11 Memorial

A call to artists for proposals has been distributed for this renovation project. The artist will work closely with Chief Torres and his staff on the project.

City Hall Annex Public Art and CRA Building Public Art

New public art will be installed in these buildings. Project start up meeting next month.

Public Art Archive

Documentation of the public art installations in the city will begin; it is important to document location photos of the art, artist materials, maintenance, etc. since the collection is growing.

Public Art Board

Evaluate the current board structure, schedule and make updated recommendations based on national best practices.

Mural Guidelines

Planning Department developing mural guidelines and procedures for the City. This will include stakeholder and community engagement in the community.
