ORDINANCE NO. 240-09-148

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAUDERHILL AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 10, GARBAGE AND TRASH/UNSANITARY AND UNSIGHTLY CONDITIONS/ABANDONED REAL PROPERTY; ARTICLE II, RECYCLABLE WASTE, SECTION 10-22, FEES TO UPDATE THE FEE SCHEDULE EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2024 PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE (REQUESTED BY CITY MANAGER, DESORAE GILES-SMITH)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAUDERHILL, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That the City of Lauderhill Code of Ordinances, Chapter 10, Garbage and Trash/Unsanitary and Unsightly Conditions/Abandoned Real Property, Article II, Recyclable Waste, Section 10-22, Fees, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 10-22. - Fees.

- (a) Sec. 10-22. Fees.
- (a) Collection; application. Each single-family unit within the city, as defined in section 10-20 of this Code shall be charged a fee of six seven dollars and forty nine fifty-seven cents (\$6.49) (\$7.57) per month as a fee for the collection of recyclable waste. Each multifamily unit, as defined in section 10-20 of this Code shall be charged a fee of four five dollars and seventy one cents \$4.70 \$5.01 per month as a fee for the collection of recyclable waste. The fee shall be collected concurrent with and under the same procedures as the city's water and sewer service fees, sections 21-45 and 21-46 of this Code. Application for service under section 21-46 shall constitute application for service under this section. All current applications under section 21-46 which are in effect as of April 27, 1992, shall be applications for this service. The fee as enacted hereunder shall be effective July 1, 2023 October 1, 2024.
- (b) *Increase/decrease*.
 - (1) Periodically, the fee as enacted herein may be increased or decreased pursuant to the formula as set forth in section 5.01 of the Exclusive Residential Recycling Collection Service Franchise Agreement, as originally adopted by Resolution 13R-10-217, as assigned to Waste Management via Resolution 17R-08-207, and as extended through July 31, 2021 via Resolution 19R-07-131, and as further extended and amended through September 30, 2024 via Resolution 21R-05-96, and as further extended and amended through September 30, 2025 via Resolution No. 24R-09-215. A copy of said resolutions and the residential recycling agreement shall be retained in the clerk's office for public inspection at all times while this section is in effect.
 - (2) The following increased or new fees are approved:
 - a. Newspapers; clear glass; aluminum; plastics one, two and three; brown and green glass; and steel cans, single-family residential units: six

- <u>seven</u> dollars and <u>forty-nine fifty-seven</u> cents (<u>\$6.49</u>) (<u>\$7.57</u>) per unit per month.
- b. Newspapers; clear glass; aluminum; plastics one, two and three; brown and green glass; and steel cans, multifamily residential units of four five dollars and seventy one cents \$4.70 (\$5.01) per unit per month.

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<u>SECTION 2</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed as to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
