

Mr. Hobbs acknowledged the request, stating his staff would draft a regular update document that would be presented at each of the Board's meetings.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

This was the first item discussed on the agenda after the roll call.

- **Board's Recommendation for Additional Appointment**

Vice Chairperson Murray-Hylton mentioned the subject item was discussed at a previous Board meeting, and at the last City Commission meeting, the Board members present told the Commission they preferred to have residents from already represented areas of Lauderhill fill the vacant positions for unrepresented areas, rather than reduce the number of zones. She stated, while waiting for the meeting to start, she identified, based on homeowners' association (HOA), three persons willing to serve, so it would be good to get even two out of them to serve. If not, residents from already represented areas could serve on the Board on behalf of the residents in the unrepresented areas until someone from the latter could be found to serve on the Board, and this would ensure the Board could achieve a quorum at its meetings. The areas currently unrepresented on the Board were two, four and five. She stated Ari Shender was nominated for another Board, and she would call him to see if he was willing to represent area two, and for four and five, she was unsure how active the homeowners were, but she would begin with the two contact persons for those areas. One would be in Windermere, and the other would be in central Lauderhill. She would send all three persons an email with an application form, inviting them to serve on the Board.

Ms. Myrie-Reid made a motion, seconded by Ms. Cassandra Wright, to approve the action as stated above by Vice Chairperson Murray-Hylton for filling vacant seats for areas two, four and five. The motion passed 5-0.

VIII. COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Helen Smith, Lauderhill resident of the Tree Garden community, expressed concerns about street lights, which she called the City about a number of times and was told it was an outdoor light that faced the building, and she told staff the pole was located on the Windermere side of the roadway, but the lighting faced her community. She said there were a number of shootings in their community in 2019, and though they were not publicized, they could be found on Google. The lighting needed to be fixed, as she was using the light from her phone to go in and out of her home, and in her building, the residents were mostly single-women with families. Her building number was 1788.

Mr. Hobbs surmised this was along NW 17th and NW 52nd, to the back of the apartment community.
