# ARTICLE III. GARBAGE, REFUSE AND TRASH1

The Franchise Agreement with Waste Management, Inc. of Florida to provide solid waste collection services is hereby approved commencing October 1, 2025 and ending September 30, 2026 pursuant to the Second Revised Amendment to the Agreement as approved via Resolution No. 24R-09-215.
