My name is Kim Schell, I have been a Lauderhill resident for over 30 years. I reside at 8260 NW 46 Court, Lauderhill. I have served this community as a Broward School teacher, as a Peace Ambassador for

Lauderhill Peace 365, and as a volunteer for Moms Demand Action.

I was planning to speak tonight on behalf of the Lauderhill Health and Prosperity Partnership and to call for the immediate rejection of Resolution No. 25R-09-166. But, a health issue has derailed my plan. So, I am sending you my remarks in this email.

The LHPP is an invaluable asset to the entire Lauderhill community. The actions by this Commission to defund and dismantle the LHPP are clearly not driven by a desire to put community first. LHPP is a volunteer driven partnership. It is not about Commissioner Dunn, it is about the 150 local entrepreneurs that have been supported by Lauderhill Shines. It is about the many Lauderhill citizens who have benefited from Lauderhill Peace365 workshops on conflict resolution. It is about the community-driven projects that have been brought to Lauderhill and paid for by outside investors. It is about the citizens who live in Lauderhill Point and Devon Hut that have been brought together to build safety, better health, and opportunity in their neighborhoods. By defunding and dismantling the LHPP, young people lose safe spaces, entrepreneurs lose vital support, and families lose resources they rely on.

By volunteering at LHPP events throughout the city I have experienced first hand the positive impact that this work has on the people of the community. It is my belief that connection is the cure for everything. When positive connections are made, and maintained, between the leaders of our community and the citizens, miraculous things happen. I saw this effect in my classroom many times as a teacher. My question to you is, have you attended an LHPP meeting or event to see how this partnership is run? I don't think that you have. Because if you had, you would not be working so furiously to defund and dismantle this highly effective and impactful partnership.

Therefore, once again, I and many others who support the work of the LHPP are calling for immediate rejection of Resolution No. 25R-09-166.
