Request Action:

Pass an Ordinance authorizing the continued requirement to comply with CDC Guidelines on city premises to protect the health, safety and welfare of employees and members of the public while the city remains under a State of Emergency.

Need:

Pass an Ordinance to require continued compliance with CDC guidelines.

Summary Explanation/ Background:

On May 3, 2021, Governor Ron DeSantis passed Executive Order 21-102 which suspended all emergency orders that imposed any COVID-19 restrictions upon individuals or businesses. The effect of which would also apply to facial coverings and social distancing guidelines. While the Governor suspended any *emergency orders*, he went on to say in Section 4 that the Executive Order does *not* prohibit political subdivisions of the State from enacting ordinances pursuant to regular enactment procedures to protect the health, safety and welfare of its population. It is important to note that the Governor did *not* terminate, revoke or rescind the Declaration of the State of Emergency for Florida which remains in effect. The City of Lauderhill feels strongly that it is essential to continue to protect its employees, residents and members of the public who may choose to access and utilize city premises. As such, the City feels it is in the best interest of all to continue to require compliance with the then current CDC guidelines while the city remains under a declared state of emergency. Further, private businesses have clearly been granted the discretion to choose to continue to impose the CDC guidelines, so governmental businesses should be entitled to the same proprietary decision when conducting day-to-day business. The City of Lauderhill is granted proprietary powers pursuant to Section 1.01 of the City Charter and Article VIII, Section 2(b) of the Florida Constitution.
