Subject: Request to purchase a stair climber for PD gym

The purpose of this memorandum is to request approval for the purchase of a commercial-grade stair climber for use in the Police Department fitness facility. The equipment will support officer wellness, improve physical readiness, and enhance the department's commitment to maintaining a healthy and capable workforce.

Law enforcement personnel are frequently required to perform physically demanding tasks, including pursuing suspects, ascending multiple flights of stairs during emergency responses, conducting building searches, carrying equipment, and assisting injured individuals. These duties require a high level of cardiovascular endurance, lower-body strength, and overall fitness.

The proposed stair climber offers several benefits to the department and its personnel:

1. Improved Operational Readiness
 - o Enhances cardiovascular endurance necessary for prolonged physical activity and emergency response.
 - o Strengthens the muscles most commonly used during foot pursuits, stairwells searches, and tactical operations.
 - o Provides job-specific conditioning that directly translates to field performance.
2. Injury Reduction and Officer Safety
 - o Builds lower-body strength and endurance, helping officers perform physical tasks more effectively and safely.
 - o Provides a low-impact alternative to running, reducing stress on the knees, hips, and ankles while maintaining cardiovascular fitness.
 - o Supports injury prevention by improving balance, coordination, and muscular endurance.
3. Employee Wellness and Retention
 - o Encourages regular physical activity and healthy lifestyle habits among department personnel.

- Supports departmental wellness initiatives and demonstrates an investment in employee health and well-being.
- Provides accessible fitness opportunities for employees working varying shifts.

The purchase of a stair climber represents a one-time capital expenditure that will provide long-term benefits to department personnel. The equipment requires minimal maintenance and can be incorporated into the existing fitness program without additional staffing or operational costs.
